Selman Hoşgör’s Hitchcock-Türkan Şoray festival poster design was selected as the Best Festival Poster of the Year by the audience votes at the Ji.hlava Film Festival.

Within the scope of the National Competition, National Documentary and National Short Film Competitions held at UNIQ Open Air, **13 feature-length and 12 short-length films were screened with the participation of film crews.**

Within the scope of the Turkish Classics Revisited project, a restored version of *Asiye Nasıl Kurtulur / How to Save Asiye*, directed by Atıf Yılmaz, premiered.

There were **584 news reports about the festival in print media, 240 on national television and 2,892 on the internet.**

With the reopening of the theatres, **İKSV Galas** returned in November and December: *Last Night in Soho* (Edgar Wright) and *The Lost Daughter* (Maggie Gyllenhaal).

49th ISTANBUL MUSIC FESTIVAL

Over 30 soloists, ensembles and orchestras from Turkey and abroad participated in 20 concerts organised in 14 open-air venues

Nearly 10,000 people followed the concerts

National and global premieres of 18 compositions in 4 different concerts

ACCESSIBILITY 5 concerts for children, free workshops and activities for children and young people

ACCESSIBILITY Free 'A Musical Weekend' event for children in cooperation with İKSV Alt Kat

ACCESSIBILITY Music conservatory students followed the festival concerts for free.

ACCESSIBILITY Free 'Weekend Classics' concerts of the festival were held in Habitat Park, Etiler Sanatçılar Park, Fenerbahçe Park and Yıldız Park.

SUPPORT Organised in collaboration with TSKB, the **Women Stars of Tomorrow concert** was broadcast in 8 episodes on the İKSV YouTube channel. Within the scope of this project, **13 young women musicians were supported with the Young Women Musicians Support Fund.**

SOLIDARITY The Festival Orchestra, which was established last year under the direction of Cem Mansur with the participation of musicians who were adversely affected by the pandemic restrictions and worked as non-permanent staff, took part in the festival with soloist Hande Küden.

ECOLOGY Within the scope of the "Another Stage is Possible" project, the energy consumption at the festival was **reduced by 1/3.**

ECOLOGY In order to compensate for the carbon footprint of the festival, which was measured as 32,922 kg, **215 saplings were planted on behalf of the musicians who took the stage.**

Honorary Award was presented to **Pēteris Vasks** and Lifetime Achievement Award was presented to **Prof. Dr. Cihat Aşkın.**

The composition commissioned to **Pēteris Vasks** in 2020 was performed by the Modigliani Quartet in its Turkish premiere.

As part of the *Before the Concert with Can Çakmur* series, **four programmes** were broadcast on YouTube, Spotify and Apple Podcasts.

With the participation of Aydın Būke, Ahmet Altınel, Mehmet Nemutlu, Özkan Manav, Hasan Uçarsu, Sungu Okan, Ali Bektaş, Arzu Öztürkmen and Zeynep Oktay Uslu, **4 Pre-Concert Talks** were organised.

28th ISTANBUL JAZZ FESTIVAL

1-24 September

Nearly **34,000 audiences** followed nearly **50 concerts** organised in **10 open-air venues**

ACCESSIBILITY **29 free concerts, 4 workshops and 1 film screening**

ACCESSIBILITY The free **Jazz in the Parks** concerts of the festival were held in Küçükçekmece Göl Kenarı Amphitheatre, Şişli Habitat Park, Kadıköy Kalamış Park, Beşiktaş Sanatçılar Park and Beylikdüzü Yaşam Vadisi. The festival programme also included **#IstanbulBirSahne concerts**, which were held free of charge with the cooperation of Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality and Kültür AŞ.

SOLIDARITY In cooperation with the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), the **Abdulrahman Zaibak Trio concert** was made accessible for those living in Turkey with a refugee status.

SUPPORT Within the scope of the *Young Jazz* project, **6 music bands** were introduced to the professional stage at the festival's Jazz in the Parks concerts. In addition, **in cooperation with Sony Music Turkey**, young jazz bands Cazcuz, August, Deniz Akan Trio, Gökhan Ulusoy Trio and Kick the Switch made their first professional recordings. **Mehmet Uluğ Fund provided 70,000 TL for the production of the album Young Jazz 21**, which was released digitally and to which Volkan Öktem, Önder Focan, Selen Gülün, Cenk Erdoğan, Okan Kaya also contributed.

Lifetime Achievement Award was presented to **Tülay German**.

Within the scope of **Vitrin: Showcase for Contemporary Music from Turkey**, 4 panels were held at Beykoz Kundura with 16 participants, and **22,000 viewers** followed the panels with broadcasts on YouTube.

SALON İKSV

More than 2,500 people attended the **+1 Presents Gezgin Salon: Balthazar concert**, and Dilan Balkay, who took the stage before the concert held at Volkswagen Arena on Saturday 20 November.

Nearly 5 million people watched the three programmes: Evdeki Saat, Madrigal and Ufuk Beydemir recorded at Salon İKSV for **Garanti BBVA ile Sesini Aç** on YouTube.

As part of the same series, **Mor ve Ötesi Acoustic** concert will be released on 31 December.

Nearly 300,000 people watched **Büyük Ev Ablukada** and **Lalalar** on YouTube with the two programmes recorded at Salon İKSV for the **Jam Session**.

25th ISTANBUL THEATRE FESTIVAL

22 October-20 November

11 productions from abroad and 13 productions from Turkey staged in 10 venues and online

Nearly 8,000 people watched the physical screenings of the festival and nearly 7,000 people watched the online screenings

SUPPORT Istanbul Theatre Festival also undertook the production and hosted the premiere of the play *Beni Sakın Yumruklardan* written by Ceren Ercan within the scope of the Co-Production Project initiated by BKM, DasDas, ENKA Arts, İKSV and Zorlu PSM in 2020, in order to produce new theatre works that will contribute to the cultural accumulation of Turkey.

The festival programme included 2 audio plays, 1 dance performance reaching 750 children with 1 screen show, in addition to 2 theatre plays. In the *Bu İşte Bir Kadın Var (There Is a Woman Behind This)* section of the festival, which was created to support women's production and make it visible, 4 productions were staged. Nearly 1,000 people participated in 10 events in the *Learning and Training Programme*.

GÜLRİZ SURURİ-ENGİN CEZZAR THEATRE ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD

SUPPORT The selection committee will grant the total amount of 210,000 TL for the 2020 and 2021 awards to the theatre companies with a stage in Istanbul that have been adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

SOLIDARITY According to the criteria defined by the selection committee, the award was shared among 14 theatre stages that contribute to the culture and arts life of Istanbul under difficult conditions.

ISTANBUL BIENNIAL

The 17th Istanbul Biennial exhibitions, which were planned to be held this year, were postponed to **17 September-20 November 2022**.

ACCESS Radio Biennial, which was broadcast weekly on Açık Radio as part of the Biennial, was completed this year with **26 programmes**. The programme hosted 22 artists and artist collectives, 15 individuals and collectives collaborating with artists, 7 academics, 13 writers and researchers, 15 poets and 8 curators.

SOLIDARITY On the occasion of 8 March International Women's Day, a two-day online event series were organised with the support of the German Society for International Cooperation (GIZ): *Side by Side Together! Women's Collective Memory in Refuge and Building a Common Future*. The event hosted **8 speakers, 20 civil society organisations and an online concert**. It was streamed on YouTube with Turkish, English and Arabic subtitles and **watched by nearly 8,000 people**.

SUPPORT Istanbul Biennial Study and Research Programme (ÇAP) **received 262 applications** for 2021-2022 period. **30 artists and researchers** benefited from the programme. This year, the programme was organised in collaboration with BAK, basis voor actuele kunst, one of Europe's most important research-oriented art institutions. Within the scope of this cooperation, **8 ÇAP artists and researchers** had the opportunity to participate in seminars and workshops offered by BAK, basis voor actuele kunst. *BAK Fellowship for Situated Practice*, a post-academic research programme was launched in Istanbul, Jakarta and Utrecht. In this context, the Istanbul Research Team was established with artist **Özge Açıkkol**, artist and researcher **Kerem Ozan Bayraktar**, artist and researcher **İlgin Hancıoğlu**, choreographer and performance artist **İlyas Odman** and artist-writer **Marina Papazyan**.

SOLIDARITY In collaboration with 17th Istanbul Biennial and Kunstverein Hamburg, with the additional support of SAHA Association, an international education platform initiated by Ahmet Öğüt: *Silent University Orientation Programme* was launched.

ISTANBUL DESIGN BIENNIAL

The 5th Istanbul Design Biennial, which started in 2020, continued until July 2021. Within the scope of the biennial, sustainable works and projects were also placed in public spaces.

Within the scope of the 5th Istanbul Design Biennial's final exhibition, conversations were held with the participation of 14 speakers on the floating garden travelling from Golden Horn to Büyükada: *Büyükada Song Lines*.

ACCESS The digital closing event titled *Not quite a finnisage!* was watched by 18,500 people.

Empathy Sessions programme was broadcasted in 8 episodes on İKSV YouTube channel.

SOLIDARITY The **Curatorial Studies Module** offered within the scope of the design master's programme, which was implemented as a joint project of Kadir Has University, Istanbul Biennial and Istanbul Design Biennial, **graduated 8 students in the first semester and 15 students in the second semester.**

SUPPORT With the support of the US Embassy and in collaboration with the Center for Arts, Design and Social Research, **4 researchers were selected from 27 applicants** as a result of the open call for the research programme titled *Designing Resilience*. The diaries of the researchers were published on the Istanbul Design Biennial website.

SUPPORT With the support of the European Union's 'Common Cultural Heritage: Preservation and Dialogue between Turkey and the EU-II Grant Scheme' offered by the European Union and in partnership with Karlsruhe University of Art and Design, an **open call** was made for the guest designer programme *Camekân*. The call received **34 applications and 8 participants** to participate in the programme were selected.

SOLIDARITY Within the scope of *Design Routes*, which was organised for the first time as part of the public programme of the 4th Istanbul Design Biennial, the documentary works of the *Migrating Flavours* project were carried out in cooperation with UNHCR. The documentary will meet audiences in 2022.

5th Istanbul Design Biennial book: *Empathy Revisited: Designs for more than one* was published in two volumes in Turkish and English.

PAVILION OF TURKEY AT THE 17TH INTERNATIONAL ARCHITECTURE EXHIBITION, LA BIENNALE DI VENEZIA 22 May-21 November

An average of 1,810 visitors per day, totalling 298,600 visitors

ACCESS 1,200 people watched the Turkey Pavilion preview video shared on the İKSV YouTube channel and the Venice Biennale website

ACCESS More than 19,000 people watched the 15-minute exhibition tour shared on the İKSV YouTube channel

ECOLOGY In order to minimise waste production, exhibition materials were donated for reuse at the end of the biennial. Nearly 70 percent of the wood required for the architectural structure of the installation was provided by upcycling materials used in previous exhibitions.

With the *Architecture as Measure* exhibition curated by Neyran Turan, **Turkey Pavilion** was included among **126 architects, 16 special projects and 60 country pavilions** participating in the main exhibition of the biennial.

Throughout the biennial, **62 different contents** were published on pavilionofturkey21.iksv.org under the headings of **Paperwork, Episodes, Conversations and Essays**.

Architecture as a Measure Online Conversation Series, moderated by curator Neyran Turan with the participation of the curatorial team and invited guests on YouTube, was followed live by 1,400 people.

Presented by Deniz Ova, Director of the Istanbul Design Biennial and advisor to the Pavilion of Turkey at the International Architecture Exhibition, la Biennale di Venezia, 51,500 people watched 7 episodes of the *Turkey and Architecture at la Biennale di Venezia* interviews with participants from Turkey on YouTube.

İKSV took part in the Curatorial Collective consisting of institutions and individuals who contributed to the biennial since the preparation stage of the exhibition.

THE WALK PROJECT

SOLIDARITY A 3,5-meter puppet: **Little Amal** visited 6 cities and participated in more than 40 events for 13 days between 27 July and 8 August.

Commissioned by İKSV in Turkey, The Walk depicted the journey of Little Amal, a 9-year-old Syrian refugee girl, from the Turkish-Syrian border to the United Kingdom.

On her journey to find her mother, Little Amal travelled 8,000 km for 4 months, crossing the borders of 8 countries. İKSV, together with its cultural manager Recep Tuna, produced the Turkish part of the project. After Gaziantep, where she took her first step on 27 July, Little Amal visited Adana, Tarsus, Musalı Village - Mersin, Antalya, Pamukkale, Denizli, Selçuk, Urla, İzmir and Çeşme, and participated in culture and arts events organised in cooperation with important associations, foundations and artists. Audiences of all ages participated in the activities organised for free. Actors Bergüzar Korel and Halit Ergenç were the Ambassadors of the project in Turkey.
